#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

I write to update you on how Catherine McAuley College is responding to the extraordinary situation unfolding regarding COVID-19 (Coronavirus). This is evolving, we will keep you updated as things change. Our first priority remains the health and safety of our school community.

#### Incursions and Excursions

For the remainder of Term 1 we will only be running timetabled classes. All incursions and excursions have been postponed or cancelled. To be very clear this includes any camps, representative sports, retreats, information evenings, assemblies, Production rehearsals, Open Evening, field trips, and any student trips off campus.

## **Continued Learning**

We are ready for disruption to teaching should the College be instructed to close. The College has excellent online learning resources and is ready to provide the support required for students. Already students and teachers are using a range of online learning tools (SIMON, Google, etc.). These platforms allow for teaching activities to take place while students remain at home. Further preparations are underway to ensure that students are fully supported to maintain their learning goals.

The Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) is looking at ways to ensure continuity of learning and delivery of assessment to students completing one or more VCE Unit 3-4 and/ or VCE VET Unit 3-4 sequence. They are asking schools to be flexible and agile in ensuring delivery of assessment and we will continue to seek their advice. It would be worthwhile for VCE students to refer to the VCAA website here.

### Cleaning and Hygiene

Our cleaning program has been increased, we are speaking with students about effective hygiene behaviours and we have signage around the College as a reminder.
