- If your child has special needs, please supply reports and diagnoses
- If offered a place, complete and return the confirmation of enrolment acceptance and direct debit paperwork



Enrolment Policy

Catherine McAuley College strives for strong partnerships with the families and the parishes it serves. Families who choose to enrol their children at Catherine McAuley College do so on the understanding that they are expected to uphold and foster the Mercy Education Values of compassion, courage, hospitality, justice, respect and service. Families will be asked to recognise the importance of Religious Education for their children through supporting the prayer life and other religious celebrations and spiritual development opportunities.



Enrolment Criteria

Numbers for each class are set by the College administration in accordance with the guidelines established by the Catholic Education Office. If there are vacancies the following priorities are observed:

- Capacity of the School to accept students;
- Catholic children who are attending a Catholic Primary School;
- Catholic children who are attending a local Primary School;
- Whether a sibling of the child is currently a student of the school;
- Non-Catholic students currently attending a Catholic Primary School;
- Other Christian children who attend a local Primary School;
- Other Christian children who reside outside the local area;
- Non-Christian children who attend a local Primary School;
- Non-Christian children who reside outside the local area.

Waiting Lists

In the event where a year level is full and/or the timeline to support a student enrolment has not been met, the College will:

- Invite interested parties to place their name on a waiting list
- Take a non-refundable deposit of \$100 to hold a place on the waiting list
- Request all enrolment paperwork including past reports, external supporting documentation and references
- Request pre-enrolment PAT testing session where students will undertake PAT M and PAT R tests

If a position becomes available, and the waiting list candidates have met the requirements outlined above:

- The College Registrar will contact the applicant (in order of waiting list entry) to offer an enrolment interview

From this point forward, the standard enrolment process will be followed. Applicants should understand that the timeline from this point may be up to three weeks if all enrolments processes are adhered to.

What if my child has additional learning needs?

There are further transition opportunities for students with additional needs as part of our Learning Diversity program.

Enrolment of Students During the School Year

Catherine McAuley College is sensitive to the research regarding students changing schools. If a student seeks enrolment at the College during the year, the following considerations will occur:

- ❑ How the change of school during the year will impact the student
- ❑ What resources and supports may be required to assist the student when they commence
- ❑ What subject options and availability exists for the potential student

It is the preference for the College to welcome new students (subject to available positions) at the commencement of each term. Term 4 enrolments will not be accepted. The College will retain provision to support students and families who are currently attending a Catholic School outside a 60km radius and seeking relocation.

Transition Meeting

This is an opportunity for your family to meet with a member of leadership so we can learn more about your child and how to best support their transition to Year 7.



3. Accepting a Place

Acceptance - Year 7, 2021

To confirm your acceptance of an offer, please complete and return the **Confirmation of Enrolment Acceptance** prior to **Friday 31 July 2020**. If you do not wish to accept the position for your child, please let the College Registrar know as soon as possible by phoning 5445 9100 or emailing apetri@cmc.vic.edu.au.

Finances

Please also complete the **Request for Direct Debit** form and return the College by **Friday 31 July 2020**.

An enrolment deposit of \$100.00 is payable and will be deducted from your nominated payment method detailed in the direct debit form. This amount will be credited to your 2021 fee account.

4. Getting Started

Transition Meeting and Next Steps

Catherine McAuley College is committed to a smooth transition for all students. Our staff will work with you and the primary school to collate information to support your child in the transition to Catherine McAuley College. The first step will be a Transition Meeting with a senior member of staff. Please bring your child's most recent reports, including NAPLAN.

You will receive further information about your Transition Meeting and the next steps upon receipt of Enrolment Acceptance. Transition Meetings are currently scheduled for Wednesday 26 and Thursday 27 August 2020 however, due to COVID-19 restrictions, the timing of these meetings may change depending on advice from the Chief Health Officer, the Victorian Government and the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria Ltd (CECV).

Data and Testing

Data is one of the most powerful tools to inform, engage, and create opportunities for students with their learning. Data is much more than test scores. Data gives us insight and helps us make connections that lead to improvements.

At Catherine McAuley College, new students and Year 7 students are all tested upon enrolment, which allows teachers to best prepare for their needs in the classroom.

There are further transition opportunities for students with additional needs.

Year 7 Parent Information Evening

A Parent Information Evening will be held on 7 December 2020 commencing at 6.00pm. This evening is important to attend as valuable information about class groups will be provided and it is an opportunity to meet staff and ask questions. You will also receive details of the Pastoral Planning Day occurring before the commencement of the 2021 school year.

When arranging students into core groups and classes, many factors are considered including academic skills, social and emotional needs as well as personal strengths and interests. We request that you trust that we have considered information from a range of stakeholders in making judgements regarding class placements. We do not make changes to class groupings beyond the Parent Information Evening.

Year 7 Orientation Day

On 8 December 2020 your child will spend an Orientation Day at Coolock from 9.30am to 2.30pm. This day provides students the opportunity to meet other students and staff and participate in activities designed to further assist with their transition to Catherine McAuley College.

Bikes

Our Coolock Campus is well serviced by bike paths coming from a number of directions. Many students utilise these trails. Our central St Mary's location also allows Year 10-12 students to ride to school. There are bike racks available at both campuses. Students are required to use their own locking device and follow government laws and College directions regarding bike safety.

Uniform

Catherine McAuley College has clear required Uniform and Dress Code expectations, which cover correct wearing of uniform and accessories, hair, jewellery and makeup. Click for full information.



Laptop

To ensure our students remain leaders in technology, the College provides a laptop to all students. The cost to provide laptops, software, insurance, on-campus maintenance and technology infrastructure is included in the family fee.

Booklists

We try to keep booklist items to a minimum. Orders are placed online, and you will receive annual instructions about ordering via Campion.

Canteen

Our canteen offers fresh and healthy options for both students and staff. It is open for purchases on all school days during both recess and lunch.

Immunisations

Lockers

PAM (Parent Access Module)

New families will be provided with a log in to PAM in late Term 3, 2020. PAM is a module for parents within our learning management system, SIMON, which is used by students. It provides real-time access to keep parents updated with their child's:








ST MARY'S CAMPUS - UPPER LEVELS




COOLOCK CAMPUS - GROUND LEVEL EAST
